## Programs and Services:

**Residential Treatment:** Provides a wide spectrum of therapeutic services to children and youth throughout the State of Connecticut who cannot remain in their communities due to family issues, trauma, abuse, or serious behavioral problems.

**Transitional Group Home:** Six beds for adolescent boys preparing for independent living, located in Norwich, CT.

**Therapeutic Group Home:** A colonial home in Montville for 5 boys ages 7 to 12 who need intensive support in a community living setting.

**Special Education Program:** Provides classroom instruction, individualized instruction, computer skills, conflict resolution and off-grounds cooperative work programs all while seeking to provide personal achievement and improvement initiatives to enable students to better meet the challenges they face in their schools, families and communities.

**Emergency Shelter Program:** Provides short term assessment and respite care for children and adolescents aged 11 to 17 who are in need of a safe place to stay in a time of transition or crisis.

**Safe Homes Programs:** Provides emergency short-term placement for children who have been removed from their homes for the first time because of abuse, neglect, or hardship.

**Family Preservation & Reunification Program:** An outreach program designed to prevent out-of-home placements for children, to support families during reunification, and to improve the safety and well being of children and families.

**Foster Care Programs:** Therapeutic Foster Care and the Family Support Team are all home based treatment programs designed to provide love and guidance for children and youth in need of a stable home environment. Foster parents are supported through teams of professionals who provide intense assistance and training.

**Community Based Services:** Outpatient clinic and several in-home services to support children and families.

**Experiential Education Programs:** "Hands-on" educational and therapeutic opportunities for children, adults, families and organizations. Specialized programs include a challenge ropes course, children's farm and wildlife rehabilitation center.

**Medical Services:** All of the medical services offered in the above programs are under the supervision of our medical department.
